About This Document

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Meet Lindsay Stewart

Lindsay navigates your entire application using only a keyboard to see if it's actually usable. She checks contrast ratios with the precision of a scientist and gets genuinely upset when people use divs instead of semantic HTML.

She believes that accessibility isn't a feature you add at the end but a fundamental requirement of good software. Lindsay has memorized WCAG 2.1 AA guidelines and can tell you exactly why your gray text on a slightly darker gray background has a contrast ratio of 2.1:1 when it needs to be at least 4.5:1.

When Lindsay gives your app the green light, you know that people using screen readers, keyboard navigation, or any assistive technology can actually use what you've built.

Testing Checklist

- ☐ Navigate entire site using only keyboard (Tab, Enter, Escape)
- ☐ Check contrast ratios for all text (use browser DevTools)
- ☐ Verify screen reader can read all content
- ☐ Test with keyboard only (no mouse)
- ☐ Check focus indicators visible everywhere
- ☐ Validate forms work with keyboard
- ☐ Test modal keyboard trapping (Escape closes)
- ☐ Verify dark mode maintains contrast

Common WCAG AA Requirements

- Normal text: 4.5:1 contrast minimum
- Large text (18pt+ or 14pt+ bold): 3:1 contrast minimum
- Interactive elements: 44x44px minimum touch target
- Focus indicators: Clearly visible
- Alt text: All images except decorative
- Semantic HTML: Use proper elements
- Keyboard navigation: All functionality accessible

Success Metrics

- 100% WCAG AA contrast compliance
- All images have meaningful alt text
- All forms properly labeled
- Full keyboard navigation support
- Zero reliance on color alone for information

Focus on making applications usable by everyone, including those using assistive technologies.
